The sport of sailing has always been of particular significance in and for Austria. In the fields of tourism and leisure sports but almost even more in top-class sports. Since 1968, when Hubert Raudaschl won a silver medal in the Finn-Class in Mexico, statistics show that from an Austrian perspective, sailing has been by far the most successful sport at the summer Olympics. Five gold, five silver and two bronze medals bear witness to the professional and sustained work of the Austrian Sailing Association. In 2016 in Rio de Janeiro, the bronze medal won by Thomas Zajac / Tanja Frank in the Nacra 17-Class actually saved the Austrian team from going home without a single medal. Austria has also consistently made a name for itself as the organiser of important sailing tournaments.

The European Championships in the 49er, 49erFX and Nacra 17, were originally planned to take place on Lake Garda in May. The event was then re-awarded to the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee. Over 400 athletes will compete for the title of European Champions in three classes. I will, of course, keep my fingers crossed that our Austrian sailors will be able to make the most of their home advantage in this elite field.

I would like to thank the organisers, all of the sponsors and the voluntary helpers, without whose efforts the smooth running of the event would not be possible. And I wish all participants exciting and fair races.

Günther Lux - Head of Organizing Committee

Günther Lux is the head of the Organizing Committee. He came to the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee as a youth and started sailing with an Optimist. After some years he was strong (and big) enough to move on to the Star boat.

For about 30 years he had the lead of the organizing committees. Together with Gert Schmidleitner who acts as an IRO for 25 years (one of the longest IROs worldwide) he organized more than 20 World- and European-Championships.

Union-Yacht-Club Attersee is well known for a detailed organization on- and offshore. Especially the social events, which are often very small, have high standard.

"It is not the idea of the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee to generate financial income by running regattas. Neither the big ones, nor the small", Günther Lux is telling the story to who ever wants to know, why the club has more than 30 events every year. "In our statute the support of the sailing sport is the main idea for the existence of the club."

A big opening ceremony is always a good start to an event. But this year all is a different. The Corona-19 pandemic crosses out a lot of what we would like to offer to our guests at such an event.

Günther Lux continues: "We are very happy that the Corona-19 pandemic in Austria is not as severe as in other countries. The government allows us to sail small regattas as well as big ones like this Europeans in the three Olympic speed classes. We have to follow some rules like to force all participants and coaches to show up with a negative Covid-test. All officials must be tested too. And everybody has to keep physical distance outside and to wear masks inside. But we are allowed to sail!"

The grand opening and closing ceremonies as well as the parties during the event had to be cancelled because they would not be safe. We try to provide aftersail snacks in a safe way, but this is not our usual custom.

The class associations selected our club in the middle of June to organize this event, which is very very late. Within this short time-frame it was not possible to find many sponsors.

The entry fee we normally put into the social events to show hospitality to our guests. This year we have to use that money for preventing the spread of the Coronavirus.

So at this event the focus is on sailing only. We hope you accept that we show our hospitality by trying to organize this event as well as possible with this little time, we need to leave out the social events.






Boat Park and Car Parking - Overview






49er: Boat Park and Car Parking

Emergency meeting points and safety

For more safety on the water we defined four emergency meeting points which are easy to find from the water side.

At all these points an emergency car is able to take over an injured person. If a helicopter is needed it can land near all these four meeting points.

The emergency meeting points are marked in the sketches with red dots and yellow contour.

During the event we have a rescue boat with divers and a paramedic on board on the water any time during racing.

You may alarm that boat by calling

If you have an injured person already on a coach boat and bring it to an emergency meeting point yourself, please alarm the ambulance by calling the national emergency number

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Notice of Race

The Organizing Authority is the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee in conjunction with the International 49er and Nacra 17 Class Associations.

OeSV EDV Number 9574, 9575, 9576 OeSV Permission Number: 81207 dated July 23rd, 2020

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, will apply.
- 1.3 The Class Rules will apply except for any that are altered by the Notice of Race or the Sailing Instructions. The Class Race Management Guidelines will also apply.
- 1.4 No National Prescriptions will apply.
- 1.5 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.6 This is a World Sailing 100 point ranking event.
- 1.7 There will be special Covid-19 rules. The special Covid-19 rules will be published about three weeks before the start of the event in an amendment to this NOR. The rules may e.g. include the requirement of a test competitors need at arrival, a test to be made on site, daily temperature measurement, need of wearing masks in restaurants...

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority.
- 2.2 For 49er and 49erFX the bottom two panels of the jib area shall be restricted to Class and Event advertising and all competitors shall place class nominated branding on their jibs according to the World Sailing approved 49er Class jib advertising policy. For Nacra 17 the area of the jib, except for the visibility window, shall be restricted to Class and Event advertising and all competitors shall place class nominated branding on their jibs according to the World Sailing approved Nacra 17 Class jib advertising policy.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Competitors shall comply with World Sailing Eligibility Code (Regulation 19).
- 3.2 For the 49er gender is open. For the 49erFX gender is female. For the Nacra 17 teams must be of mixed gender.
- The maximum number of entries will be as follows:
 49er 105 boats
 49erFX 70 boats
 Nacra17 40 boats.
 - If the number of entries is higher than these numbers, the respective class executive will decide which teams' entry is accepted. In cases of rejected entry, the full entry fee will be refunded to teams whose entry is not accepted.
- 3.4 All competitors shall be fully paid-up members of the International 49er or Nacra 17 Class Associations.
- 3.5 Entries should be received by the Organizing Authority no later than August 28th, 2020 and will only be accepted when entry fee is transferred to Union-Yacht-Club Attersee

(IBAN: AT59 3436 3800 0001 9406;

BIC: RZOOAT2L363).

Entries after August 28th, 2020 will be accepted on the discretion of the Organizing Authority with the payment of an additional Euro 100,--.

4. FEES

Entry Fees:

For 49er and 49erFX: Euro 500,-- and Nacra 17: Euro 550,-- (until August 28th, 2020) These fees include the International Class Championship Fee of Euro 50,-- for the 49er and 49erFX and Euro 100,-- for the Nacra 17.

Coach Fee per person: Euro 100,-- incl. social events. No separate fee for support boat registration.

In case the event is cancelled due to Covid-19, a portion of the entry fee may not be refunded to pay for the fixed costs of running the regatta.



5. FORMAT OF RACING.

- 5.1 The Championships will consist of an Opening Series. For 49er and 49erFX the Opening Series will be divided into a Qualifying Series and a Final Series, for Nacra 17 the Opening Series will be a Single Series.
- 5.2 There will be no Medal Races.

6. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

6.1 Saturday, September 26th

Only teams pre-booked to train at the host club will be allowed into the venue before September 26th. See appendix B for training options.

6.2 On Sunday, October 4th there will be no warning signal after 1600.

7. MEASUREMENT

- 7.1 There will be no inspection prior to racing. Spot measurement checks may be carried out during the Championships.
- 7.2 For 49er, 49erFX, and Nacra 17 only one set of sails and one forestay shall be used throughout the duration of the Championship.
- 7.3 Equipment shall only be replaced with permission of the Technical Committee.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available on the website in time.

9. VENUE

The 2020 Forward WIP 49er, 49erFX and Nacra 17 European Championships will be held at Attersee, Austria.

49er: Häuplhof

49erFX and Nacra 17: Union-Yacht-Club Attersee Please bring your own weights for secure parking your boat on all areas.

10. THE COURSES

Courses will be:

For 49er and 49erFX - windward/leeward with a gate at the leeward end of the course. For Nacra 17 - windward/leeward with a spreader mark at the windward end and a gate at the leeward end of the course.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 and RRS P2.1 are changed so that the Two-Turns penalty is replaced by a One-Turn penalty.

12. SCORING

- 12.1 The Low Points Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply to the Opening Series.
- 12.2 At least 5 races are required to constitute the Championship.

13. SAFETY

In the event of an emergency the meeting point for safety personnel and the dropping off point for safety boats coming from the racing area will be at the crane of the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee. This meeting point will be where an ambulance will be waiting when required. The location of the Emergency Meeting Points are shown in Appendix C, published in time.



14. SUPPORT BOATS

- 14.1 Support boats shall be registered with the Organising Authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and the Class Support Boat Regulations which can be viewed on the Class website. Team leaders/coaches shall register at https://49er.org/event/2020-european-championship/ and https://nacra17.org/events/2020-european-championship/ and complete on-site registration at the race office at the venue.
- 14.2 All support boats shall clearly display the 3 letter national code of their WS Member National Authority at all times while afloat. The minimum height for the letters shall be 200mm.
- 14.3 If called upon support boats will be required to act as rescue boats.

15. INTERNATIONAL JURY

An International Jury will be appointed in accordance with RRS 91(b). Its decisions will be final as provided in RRS 70.5. There is the possibility that the International Jury is not on site. In this case hearings will be set up online.

16. PRIZES

Prizes for the Championships will be announced and awarded at the end of Racing for the first three places overall and for the other fleet(s) respective-ly.

The winners will receive medals -

- European Open Championship 1st, 2nd, 3rd
- European Championship 1st, 2nd, 3rd
- Silver fleet winner
- Bronze fleet winner (if applicable)

17. RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency a boat shall neither make nor receive radio transmissions, text messages or cellular phone calls while racing.

The use of VHF is not permitted in Austria!

18. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall have valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of at least Euro 1,500,000 (or equivalent) per incident.

19. ANTIDOPING

By participating, the athlete undertakes to comply with the Anti-Doping Rules of the Anti-Doping Federal Act 2007 as well as the relevant Anti-Doping Rules of the relevant national and international federation (especially statutes, sports regulations, competition rules). Athletes are defined as persons who are members or licensees of a sports organization or an organization affiliated with it or who were such members or licensees at the time of a potential Anti-Doping Rule Violation, or who participate in competitions organized by a sports organization or an organization affiliated with it or who receive federal sports funding.

The organizers and hosts strictly reject doping. As a participant you assure that you have not taken or will not take any prohibited substances or prohibited methods for doping purposes. Information on whether a medicine or a method of treatment is prohibited can be found here: https://www.nada.at/de/medizin/medikamentenabfrage. This service of the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA Austria) is also available as "MedApp" for Android and IOS.

If the Athlete is required to take prohibited substances or use prohibited methods following medical or dental diagnosis, it is strongly recommended that all medical certificates and findings be retained for any retroactive Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). 20. RISK STATEMENT

RRS 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission:
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;




- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities:
- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances:
- g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the event and to attend any competitor briefing held for this event.

21. MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

- 21.1 Where consent for imagery has been given by a competitor participating in the Championship, competitors grant to the Organizing Authority, the International 49er and the Nacra 17 Class Associations and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of competition without compensation.
- 21.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the Organizing Authority.
- 21.3 Competitors may be required for interviews and press conferences at the Championship.

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

PROTEST







The app Protest helps to solve rules relevant conflicts in sailing regattas.

With a series of yes/no questions, in which the Racing Rules of Sailing of World Sailing are checked in parallel, the app builds up the situation and presents the resulting decision.

A menu provides access to the facts found, the conclusions and the rules applied.

The default language of the app is, depending on the main-language of the device English or German: If the phone/pad is set to German as system-language the app language is German, in all other cases it's English.

The texts of the situation, conclusions and facts can be switched (independently of the app language) directly between English and German since version 2.1.0.

The Venue

The Lake

Lake Attersee, situated in the very south of the Austrian province "Upper Austria" – the area is called "Salzkammergut" – 50 km east from Salzburg. It has a length of 20 km (app.), a width of 3 km (app.). The lake is 172 m deep.

Wind systems

Because of the unique topographical situation the "Rosenwind (Wind of Roses)" is the typical thermal wind on lake Attersee. While having stable sunny weather a vertical flow from NE comes up as a result to the heating of the mountains in the south of the lake. This exclusive steady breeze while having high-pressure situation is good for 9 – 12 knots

in average, rarely up to 18 knots.

The second main wind direction is a meteorological "west wind". Very different in strength (sometimes 20 knots and more) and main direction (varying from SSW to NW). It is the typical bad weather wind on our lake. Particularly on the western shore of the lake it brings smooth water but offshore squalls which makes these conditions a real "highlight" and action for sailors.

The third possibility is the wind from south. This may blow in rainy conditions without westerly flows with 6 - 15 knots, as a morning breeze with 4 to 12 knots and after bad weather situation clearing the sky with up to 25 knots.





Summary of the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee history

April 21st, 1886

- Constitutional meeting of the Union-Yacht-Club (UYC).
- Edward Drory, a British engineer born 1844 in Berlin, has the idea to unite all yacht sportsmen in one club, which has the same statutes and banner.
- Numerous guests from Vienna spend their summer vacation in the Salzkammergut area.

July 10th, 1886

- Eugene Baron of Ransonnet-Villez founds the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee as a branch club of the UYC.
- The purpose of the club is a sporty and social get-together.

1887 and the years thereafter

- First organisation of the "Atterseewoche", a regatta series which is organized yearly.
- The UYCAs assumes the representation of the UYC abroad.
- Piers and boat sheds exist at the turn of the century at the UYCAs.

1908

- · Gustav Fritz donates the club house.
- Chief engineer Josef Stierböck coordinates the completion of its construction.
- Both gentlemen are appointed as honorary members of the UYCAs.

The first years of the 20th Century

- The "Sonderklasse" has a special importance during the sailing activities of those years.
- The UYCAs and the Attersee are one of the major bases of the "Sonderklasse" now and then.
- Numerous keel yachts find their home at the Attersee like Star, Dragon and others.

1946

Foundation of the Austrian Sailing Association.


The 50s to present:

- The club area has been enlarged continuously.
- There are nine Union-Yacht-Clubs today, which are loosely united in the "UYC Traditionsverband".

- The UYCAs actually counts over 970 members and is the biggest Austrian sailing club.
- The UYCAs has a close relationship to regional tourism with about 20.000 overnight stays of regatta guests.
- There is a strong focus on working with young sailors and a close cooperation with the ASVÖ Attersail team in the classes Optimist, Zoom8, Laser R, 29er and 420er.
- The UYCAs was honoured for being the absolut best club by the Austrian Sailing Association "OeSV" in reference to sport performance of the sailors of the UYCAs in the years 2005 and 2006.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

[NP] denotes a rule that shall not be grounds for protests by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the International Jury.

[SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the Race Committee without a hearing or a discretionary penalty applied by the International Jury with a hearing.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, will apply.
- 1.3 The Class Rules of the International 49er and Nacra 17 Class Associations will apply except for any that are altered by the Notice of Race or the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.4 No National Authority prescriptions will apply.
- 1.5 [DP] Penalties for breaches of RRS 41, the Class Rules or the Equipment Inspection Regulations are at the discretion of the International Jury.
- 1.6 For 49er and 49erFX the bottom two panels of the jib area shall be restricted to Class and Event advertising and all competitors shall place class nominated branding on their jibs according to the World Sailing approved 49er Class jib advertising policy. For Nacra 17 the area of the jib, except for the visibility window, shall be restricted to Class and Event advertising and all competitors shall place class nominated branding on their jibs according to the World Sailing approved Nacra 17 Class jib advertising policy.
 - All boats shall place the Class nominated stickers on their booms.
- 1.7 This is a World Sailing ranking 100 point event.

2. **IDENTIFICATION** [DP][NP][SP]

- 2.1 Boats will be required to affix the stickers provided by the Organising Authority on both sides of the forward 25% of the hull, 200mm from the bow. Boats shall affix the stickers in accordance with any instructions given by the Organising Authority.
- 2.2 [SP] Provided two or more qualifying races have been completed, from Wednesday 30 September onwards, each day while racing, the sailors of the first, second and third boats in series ranking at the beginning of the day shall wear yellow, blue and red lycra bibs respectively. These bibs will be available

at the Race Office each day from two hours before the first scheduled warning signal of the day and shall be returned by competitors as soon as possible after the day's racing.

3. CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT [NP]

- 3.1 Boats may be required to carry on board cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the Organising Authority. Corrector weights may be required for boats without cameras. Competitors may also use their own camera recording equipment and attachments, but these are to be removable for weighing. A boat shall not be given redress based on a claim involving this equipment. This changes RRS 62.1.
- 3.2 [DP][SP][NP] The Organising Authority will supply GPS tracking units for use during the Qualifying Series and the Final Series. Boats shall carry these GPS units whilst racing. The GPS units shall be picked up every morning from the Race Office before going afloat and shall be returned to the Race Office no later than the end of protest time.
- 3.3 No competitor or support team shall use a drone over the racing area.

4. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board on the European Championships website

https://49er.org/event/2020-european-champion-ship/#noticeboard.

5. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted not less than two hours before the scheduled warning signal on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the timing of races, will be posted by 2000 the day before it will take effect.

6. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 6.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the official flagpole located on the lawn in front of the clubhouse. When a signal is displayed over a fleet flag, it applies to that fleet only.
- 6.2 [DP][NP][SP] Flag D displayed ashore with one sound signal means: "The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag D is displayed or not before the scheduled time. Boats shall not leave their allocated berth until this signal is made".

8. FORMAT OF RACING - QUALIFYING SERIES AND FINAL SERIES

For 49er and 49erFX - the Opening Series will be divided into a Qualifying Series and a Final Series. For Nacra 17 - the Opening Series will be a Single Series

9.1 In the Qualifying Series, for 49er the class flag will be the class insignia on a background of the colour of the appropriate fleet, yellow or blue and for 49erFX the class insignia on a background of yellow or blue.

- 9.2 In the Final Series, the class flags will be the 49er class insignia on a background of yellow (gold fleet) and blue (silver fleet), and for 49erFX the class insignia on a background of yellow (gold fleet) and blue (silver fleet).
- 9.3 For Nacra 17 the class flag will be the class insignia on a background of yellow.

10. RACING AREAS AND FLEET ASSIGNMENTS

- 10.1 Attachment B shows the location of the Race Areas.
- 10.2 The provisional race schedule including the time of the first warning signals and the assignment of fleets to courses will be as per Attachment D. The assignment of courses to Racing Areas will be posted before flag D is displayed.
- 10.3 [DP][NP] Boats not racing shall not sail in a course area being used by another fleet.

11. THE COURSES

- 11.1 Attachment A shows the course to be sailed, the order in which the marks are to be passed, the side on which each mark is to be left, and the signals indicating the number of rounds to be sailed.
- 11.2 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal vessel will display the approximate compass bearing from the race committee signal vessel to Mark 1.
- 11.3 There will be a gate at the leeward marks and Nacra 17 will have a spreader mark at the windward mark.
- 11.4 A gate may be replaced by a single mark to be left to port.

12. MARKS

Course A

All marks Red cone with WIP logo
Change mark Red cone with black band

Course B

All marks Yellow cylinders with Schönleitner logo Change mark Grey cylinder with Schönleitner logo

Course C

All marks Pink cone with Robline logo
Change mark Yellow cone with Robline logo

Starting marks. Race Committee vessels
Finishing marks Race Committee vessels or red mark with yellow cap



13. THE START

- 13.1 The starting line will be between staffs displaying orange flags on the starting marks.
- 13.2 [DP][NP] Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.
- 13.3 A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
- 13.4 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with ONE sound signal not less than TWO minutes before the warning signal is displayed.

14. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 14.1 To change the next leg of the course, the Race Committee will lay a change mark, which will be as detailed in SI 12. When a new mark is laid, the original mark will be removed as soon as possible.
- 14.2 For Nacra 17 only if the windward mark is changed a new spreader mark will not be laid.

15. THE FINISH

- 15.1 The finishing line will be between the staff displaying a blue flag on the main race committee vessel and either another race committee vessel displaying a blue flag or a red finishing mark with yellow cap.
- 15.2 For Nacra 17 only [DP][SP] When the blue finishing flag is displayed on the main committee vessel NO boats shall enter the Finishing Exclusion Zone other than boats that are finishing who shall leave the zone immediately. See Attachment E.

16. TIME LIMITS

16.1 The time limits and target times are as follows:

Time limit 45 minutes Finish window 15 minutes

For Nacra 17 only - in winds averaging less than 10 knots the Finishing window is increased to 20 minutes

Target time 30 minutes or as described in Appendix C

16.2 Boats failing to finish within the Finish Window (the time after the first boat sails the course and finishes) will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

17. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 17.1 Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42 will apply, as changed by SI 17.2.
- 17.2 RRS 44.1 and RSS P2.1 are changed so that the Two-Turns penalty is replaced by a One-Turn penalty.

- 17.3 Penalties for breaches of NOR 18 (Insurance), NOR 20 (Media Rights), RRS 41, the Equipment Inspection Regulations, the Class Rules and rules in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions marked [DP], are at the discretion of the International Jury.
- 17.4 Breaches of rules in the SIs marked [NP] will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 17.5 For breaches of the SIs marked [SP], the Race Committee may apply a standard penalty without a hearing. A list of these breaches and the associated standard penalties will be posted on the Official Notice Board. However, the Race Committee may protest a boat when they consider the standard penalty to be inappropriate. A boat that has been penalised with a standard penalty can neither be protested for the same incident by another boat nor can another boat request redress for this race committee action. This changes RRS 60.1, 63.1 and Appendix A5.

18. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 18.1 Protest forms are available at the Race Office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.
- 18.2 The protest time limit will be posted on the Official Notice Board. The protest time limit will be 60 minutes after the last boat of each fleet has finished the last race of the day or the Race Committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. The same time limit applies to protests by the Race Committee and Jury about incidents they observe in the Racing Area. This time limit also applies to requests for redress. This changes RRS 61.3 and 62.2.
- 18.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the designated jury room. Hearings may start before the scheduled time with the agreement of all parties.
- 18.4 The Race Committee, Technical Committee or International Jury intending to protest a boat under RRS 60.2, 60.3 or 62.4 will comply with RRS 61.1(b) by informing her by posting a notice before the end of the protest time limit.
- 18.5 A list of boats that have been penalised under RRS Appendix P on the water or have been disqualified by the jury will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 18.6 For the purposes of RRS 64.3(b) the 'authority responsible' is the Technical Committee appointed by the Organising Authority.



- 18.7 On the last day of racing of each series, a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered:
 - within the protest time limit if the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on the previous day;
 - ii) no later than 30 minutes after the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on that day. This changes RRS 66.
- 18.8 On the last day of racing of each series, a request for redress from a jury decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes RRS 62.2.
- 18.9 The time limit for requests under RRS N1.4(b) is 5 minutes after a party is informed of a decision.

19. INTERNATIONAL JURY

- 19.1 Not all members of the International Jury will be available on site. Hearings will held in a jury room with the full International Jury online.
- 19.2 Decisions of the International Jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

20. SCORING

- 20.1 The low point scoring system of Appendix A, as changed below, will apply.
- 20.2 FIVE races are required to be completed to constitute a Championship.
- 20.3 When less than FOUR races have been completed, a boat's overall score shall be the sum of her race scores.
- 20.4 When FOUR or more races have been completed, a boat's overall score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 20.5 When RRS A4.2 and A5 apply, a boat's penalty score shall be based on the number of boats in the largest group. This changes RRS A4.2 and A5.
- 20.6 Final Series fleets need not have completed the same number of races.
- 20.7 The Qualifying Series score plus the Final Series score will be the overall points for the Championship.
- 20.8 The boats in the Gold Fleet will be ranked above the boats in the Silver Fleet.

20.9 Resolving Ties

- For the Qualifying Series ties will be broken in accordance with RRS A8. In the Final Series ties will be broken in accordance with RRS A8 using the Final Series scores.
- For Nacra 17 ties will be broken in accordance with RRS A8 using the Opening Series scores.

20.10 Scoring enquiries

To request correction of an alleged error in posted race or series results, a boat shall complete a scoring enquiry form available at the Race Office. Scoring enquiry forms shall be delivered to the Race Office. A scoring enquiry may be regarded as a request for redress.

21. SAFETY [DP][SP]

- 21.1 Competitors shall wear a personal flotation device at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment.
- 21.2 [SP] Each competitor shall, before going afloat each day, check out with their tracker unit, keep while on the water and check back in immediately on returning to shore and at the latest by the end of protest time.
- 21.3 Boats not leaving the shore for the day's races shall notify the Race Office as soon as possible.
- 21.4 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible.
- 21.5 When Flag V is displayed by the race committee signal vessel, coach and other support boats will collaborate with the Race Committee in rescue tasks.

22. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- 22.1 Replacement of helm or crew shall require written approval of the PRO.
- 22.2 Request for replacement of helm or crew shall be made to the PRO at the first reasonable opportunity. On Sunday 4 October any replacement of helm or crew shall be approved no later than the protest time limit.
- 22.3 Replacement of equipment shall require written approval of the Technical Committee.
- 22.4 Request for replacement of equipment shall be made to the Technical Committee at the first reasonable opportunity. On Sunday 4 October any replacement equipment shall be approved no later than the protest time limit.

23. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 23.1 Any boat or equipment may be checked for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions at any time. On the water, a boat can be instructed by the Technical Committee to proceed immediately to a designated area for measurement checks.
- 23.2 Limitations of equipment
 - Only one set of sails shall be used during the regatta. The sails shall be noted on the form at registration.
 - ii) For 49er and 49erFX only Only one forestay shall be used during the regatta. The forestay will be tagged on Sunday evening in the boat park.



- 23.3 All boats, when not afloat, shall be placed in the official dinghy park.
- 23.4 All boats shall comply with RRS 78.1 from 1300 on the day before their first scheduled race (hereinafter referred to as "Day Zero") onwards. Non-compliance from 1300 on Day Zero until the start of the first race shall be reported, protested and penalized as if it were discovered after racing on the first day on which races for that boat have been completed. This amends RRS 78.1.

24. OFFICIAL BOATS

Official boats will be identified as follows:

Race Committee boats Red flags with letter "A"

Red flags with letter "B"

Red flags with letter "C"

Jury boats

White flags with JURY

Technical Committee boats White flags with MEASURER Media boats White flags with PRESSE

25. SUPPORT BOATS [DP][NP]

- 25.1 Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall not be in the area where boats are racing or within 100 metres of any boat racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first fleet to start until all boats have finished or the Race Committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment. This SI does not apply during rescue operations
- 25.2 At all times while on water, support boats shall display either their national flag on a staff with the top of the hoist minimum 1,5 metres above water level or their national code letters (minimum height 200mm) on the outside of the hull or on the side of the outboard motor cover.
- 25.3 Support boats shall comply with the Class Support Boat Regulations.
- 25.4 Support boats that are motoring at more than 5 knots shall remain at least 150 metres from any boat that is racing.
- 25.5 All support boats are at all times submitted to the Organising Committee and Race Committee authority and must comply with any instructions given by these authorities.
- 25.6 The International Jury may direct the Organising Authority to revoke privileges from any boat or person found to be in breach of SI 25.
- 25.7 Support vessels shall always be on the outside of the media boats (away from the fleet side) so that the media boats can capture images without coach boats in the image. This does not apply during any safety incident.

26. CODE OF CONDUCT [DP][NP]

Competitors shall comply with any reasonable request from a regatta official or a member of the Organising Authority.

27. TRASH DISPOSAL [DP][NP]

As sailors, we seek to protect and restore our waters. Trash may be placed aboard support and race committee boats.

28. RADIO COMMUNICATION [DP][NP]

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

The use of VHF is prohibited by Austrian law.

29. PRIZES

29.1 Prizes for the Championships will be announced and awarded at the end of racing.

The winners will receive medals -

- European Open Championship 1st, 2nd, 3rd,
- European Championship 1st, 2nd, 3rd,
- · Silver fleet winner.
- 29.2 Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

30. RISK STATEMENT

RRS 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;




- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for this event and to attend any competitors' meetings held for this event.

31. INSURANCE [DP][NP]


Each participating boat shall have valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of at least Euros 1,500,000 (or equivalent) per incident.


ATTACHMENT A COURSE DIAGRAMS

The Opening Series will be in two series:

- 1. Qualifying Series
- 2. Final Series

For Nacra 17

The Opening Series will be a Single Series.

For 49er and 49erFX

- 1. Qualifying Series (Days 1, 2 and 3)
- 1.1 The boats will be split into TWO fleets for 49er and TWO fleets for 49erFX of approximately equal numbers of boats. The Qualifying Series will consist of a maximum of NINE races for 49er and NINE races for 49erFX. However, if less than SIX races have been completed by all fleets by the end of Day 3, the Qualifying Series will continue.
- 1.2 The Organising Authority will make initial fleet assignments on the basis of the top 50 ranked boats from the World Sailing rankings, with the remainder being taken in numerical order of sail numbers. The method of assignment to fleets will be as per 1.3 below. The ranking will remain in force until the end of the day during which the 2nd Qualifying Race is completed by all fleets.
- 1.3 If all fleets have completed the same number of races, boats will be reassigned to fleets on the basis of their Qualifying Series scores as detailed below. If all fleets have not completed the same number of races by the end of a day, the fleets with fewer races will continue racing the following day until all fleets have completed the same number of races. However, the reassignments will be calculated for those races, numbered in order of completion, completed by all fleets. Reassignments will be made as follows:

Place in Qualifying Series Fleet assignment

First Yellow
Second Blue
Third Blue
Fourth Yellow

and so on


Fleet assignments will be based on the ranking available at 2000 that day regardless of protests or requests for redress not yet decided. However at the end of the Qualifying Series, the fleet assignments will be made no later than 0700 on the day they take effect.

- 2. Final Series (Days 4, 5 and 6)
- 2.1 The Final Series will consist of a maximum of EIGHT races for 49er and EIGHT races for 49erFX.
- 2.2 For 49er the top 30 boats and 49erFX the top 25 boats based on their Qualifying Series scores after Day 3 will race in the Gold fleet (unless the Qualifying Series has been extended under section 1.1 above).
- 2.3 The remaining boats will race in the Silver fleet.
- 2.4 Days 4 and 5 THREE races are scheduled per day for each fleet.
- 2.5 Day 6 TWO races are scheduled for each fleet.
- 2.6 On Sunday, 4 October there will be no warning signal after 1600.

For Nacra 17

- 4. Opening Series (Days 1 to 6)
- 4.1 The boats will race in a Single Fleet. The Opening Series will consist of a maximum of SEVENTEEN races.
- 4.2 Days 1 to 5 THREE races are scheduled per day.
- 4.3 Day 6 TWO races are scheduled.
- 4.4 On Sunday, 4 October there will be no warning signal after 1600.












How to get to the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee



The best way to get to the Union-Yacht-Club Attersee (UYCAs) is via the A1 West Motorway from Salzburg or Linz. Leave the A1 motorway at the exit "St. Georgen im Attergau". Take a left turn at the end of the exit ramp towards "Attersee".
